## **6. Updates on current BCCT projects – and related developments/initiatives**

### **a) Bude Business Voice (BBV)**

This CLLD funded project is being implemented as planned, and the original aim to sign up 15 local businesses has been met.

### **b) Climate Action Fund – Bude Climate Partnership (BCP)**

As previously advised, the Project Coordinator and part-time Project Support Officer started their contracts on 4 January 2021 as scheduled. The bank account (with the Cooperative Bank) is in operation and payments are being managed in accordance with a Financial Procedures Manual agreed between BCP and BCCT.

BCCT is a partner in BCP and IS attends the monthly Partnership meetings. In addition, a bi-monthly meeting of BCP and BCCT will be held, the first one which is later this month.

IS will provide further information if required.

### **c) Bude Creative Economy project**

Current position:

The small informal working group (TB, CM, IS, JG and Lou Quinton) have set up a Facebook Group to provide a platform to 'showcase' those involved locally in creative industries.

Discussions have been held with a range of potential stakeholders.

When Covid restrictions allow, and assuming there is sufficient support (including funding), the aim is to establish a local Creative Hub

As this project stems from CC's Creative Manifesto, and the aim of DCMS to pursue growth of the creative economy, BCCT has formally requested that it be added to the BSSP.

### **d) Town Team.**

Two meetings of the Town Team have been held. IS was invited to represent BCCT and attended the first meeting.

It is proposed that TB should be BCCT's representative on the Town Team at future meetings.

**e) Bude-Stratton Social Action Fund. (SAF)**

At the time of preparing this agenda, the total raised via the Crowdfunder appeal had reached £5440, though known further pledges will bring this total to over £7000.

A meeting is being planned for the organisers of the SAF (Neetside Community Centre, BCCT, Christians Together plus a representative from BSTC) to establish the criteria for grant applications.

**f) CIL Fund applications.**

For information. As advised (email 20 January) the two applications in which BCCT was involved were successful. These were:

- A community car scheme, submitted by Co-Cars Ltd showing BCCT as the lead partner, for £58,000 to set up support for 2 electric cars (and associated charging points). BSTC have agreed that they will be located at the Parkhouse Centre.
- A grant of £45,702 for Budehaven Community School for accommodation together with a wildlife garden for pupils at risk of exclusion. This application was drafted by IS on behalf of the School.

**g) Pearl Bamford Community Garden at Budehaven School**

For information. As a formally registered CIC, BCCT agreed to collaborate with Bude Cleaner Seas in a Crowdfunder for this amenity with a target of £5000. The total realised was £6125.

**7. BCCT's future**

It is recognised that BCCT, as an organisation, needs to change and Steering Group members have been sent copies of various proposals and discussion documents.

Reasons for the need to change include the changes in central government policy (away from coastal communities to local growth, levelling up, Towns Deal, etc), lack of funding, broader membership and representation, etc.

Some discussions have taken place – though the current position is best summarised by the advice given to a lost motorist – “I wouldn't start from here if I were you.”

The key factors that need to be resolved:

BCCT's structure and financing – including a name for the organisation.

The relationship with BSTC, the wider Bude Area Community Network, CC and CIOs LEP

PT to provide an update on recent developments.
