Three reasons for writing ...

1. The meeting scheduled for next Monday 9 August is cancelled. A lot is going on, but not sufficient to justify holding a meeting.
2. To send a PDF of the minutes of the BCCT meeting on 12 July.
3. Here is a brief summary of recent activity since this meeting:
 - a) The BCCT/BBV Business & Community event was well attended, with about 50+ attendees. It was good to see several Town Councillors at the event.
 - i. There were five short videos about local businesses (Dress Pack Solutions; Triangular Pixels; Dragonfly; 2 Belle Vue Avenue; Water Powered Technologies.)
 - ii. Topics covered included Localism & Devolution (Cornwall Council via a video link, but no discussion); A status report about Bude-Stratton Town Council (from Cllr Tony Gibbs); Brief summary of progress with new economic development plan; Reports about Bude Tourism; Bude Loves Local and Bude Town Team; and a presentation by Andy Cole of the activity of Newquay BID.
 - iii. The event concluded with a discussion about the potential value of collaboration and the involvement of the local business community. Further discussions with some businesses are on-going as part of the BBV project.
 - b) BCCT attended a special workshop for Parishes in the CNP to explore their contribution to the economic plan.
 - c) BCCT attended the quarterly review meeting of the BSSP on 27 July. It was agreed to undertake a prioritisation process to ensure that scarce resources were used most effectively. Action notes awaited.
 - d) Ian Saltern continues work on the economic plan. The aim is to have the new plan ready in time for adoption at the October meeting of BSTC.
 - e) Informal discussions with BSTC about a closer working relationship are in hand.
